### ***Food Policy Consulting and Technical Assistance***

I provide consulting and technical assistance on international policies and regulations to reduce purchases and consumption of energy-dense, ultra-processed foods to advocacy groups and governmental organizations, including ministries of health and finance. This includes analyzing draft regulations, providing evidence-based recommendations, disseminating research findings, providing scientific verification on mass media campaigns, submitting public comments, and organizing international scholars to provide letters of support or comments on proposed regulations. **In addition, I provide technical assistance to inform warning label design and test the impact of warnings vs. other labeling systems in countries where health organizations are considering passing labeling policies (whether through legislative action or health ministry regulatory authority).** Key policies for which I have performed these services include:

- 2020- Resolve to Save Lives: technical consultation on experiments to inform front-of-package labeling regulations in China, Thailand, Ethiopia, and India.
- 2018- 2019 Mexico regulation on front-of-package warning labels on sugary drinks and unhealthy food.  
*Outcome:* Mexico's legislature passed a warning label bill in October of 2019, with the final regulation published on January 2020
- 2016- Colombia draft Senate bill on front-of-package warning labels and marketing restrictions  
*Current status:* This bill passed the House of Representatives in October 2021; it will be discussed in a final debate in the Senate in June 2021. My team will provide data from two online experiments of warning labels to inform the discussion.

- 2016- South Africa Ministry of Health regulation on front-of-package warning labels.  
*Current status:* Under review by the Ministry of Health. My team provided technical assistance on studies to identify the design and test the impact of front-of-package labeling options.
- 2016- Brazil proposed regulation on front-of-package warning labels on sugary drinks and unhealthy food.  
*Current status:* The Brazilian Health Regulatory Authority has announced a regulation to place warning labels on sugary drinks and unhealthy foods in 2023. In the interim, we will collect data on the current nutritional quality of the food supply and conduct an additional online experiment to provide evidence to strengthen the nutritional profiling system used and design of the label (e.g., using a stop sign instead of a magnifying glass).
- 2015- Chile's ongoing regulations on front-of-package warning labels and marketing restrictions  
*Outcome:* December 2018, Chile Ministry of Health decision to implement final phase of Chilean regulation in July 2019 based on evaluation results presented at Society of Latin American Nutrition conference in Nov 2018 and presentation to Ministry of Health.
